Chemicals and appearances:

Bluish - white or silvery grey solid in various forms - turns tarnished on exposure to air

Risk associated with use:

Lead can be absorbed through contact with the skin and eyes causing irritation

Personal Protection:

Wear gloves or gauntlets when handling lead, eye protection should be worn. Do not eat, drink or smoke during work. Wash hands before eating

Storage:

Separate from food and feedstuffs and incompatible materials (further information on MSDS)

Disposal:

Return any unused product to supplier, or plant depot. Any material contaminated by the product should be designated as special waste, and disposed of through a specialist waste disposal contractor
